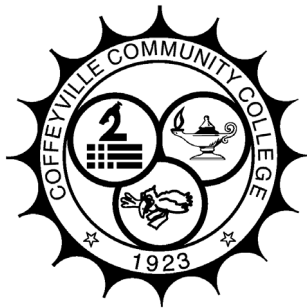

## **MISSION**

Coffeyville Community College is dedicated to identifying and addressing community and area needs, providing accessible, affordable quality education and training, and promoting opportunities for lifelong learning.

## **REGISTRATION PROCESS**

Registration consists of students selecting appropriate courses, program planning with an academic advisor and payment of tuition and fees to the College in full or by arranging an acceptable payment plan through Raven Access prior to the first day of classes.

Students should plan their academic programs carefully in order to keep subsequent changes to a minimum. FAILURE TO ATTEND CLASS, ONCE REGISTERED DOES NOT CANCEL REGISTRATION IN ANY CLASS OR CLASSES, nor does it release a student's financial obligation.

### **NOTE**

Registration for six (6) credit hours or less may be taken by telephone through the last business day of the week prior to the start of classes. Enrollment information must be completed in the Advising Office. A student must finalize telephone registration by the last business day of the week prior to the first class meeting or be dropped from courses

## **CHANGES IN REGISTRATION**

If a student wishes to change class time, drop a class or add a class he/she must contact the Registrar's Office and complete a Schedule Change Form. The procedure is not finalized until the student receives authorized signatures on the form including a signature from the Registrar's Office and the student's academic advisor.

Failure to change registration, except according to the above procedure, will result in a grade of "F" recorded on the permanent record of the student. A notation of "W" (withdrawal) will be made on the student's permanent record if he/she officially withdraws prior to the published withdrawal date on the Master Calendar.

### **Adding a Course**

Students who wish to add a course after their initial enrollment must complete a Schedule Change Form in the Registrar's Office.

1. A student will be allowed to add a course (with Instructor approval) up to and including the Final Add Date as indicated on the Master Calendar. The Final Add date is determined by calculating 25% of the allotted class time. Courses not meeting the entire semester will be calculated in the same manner.

2. Any class added after the semester begins requires the signature (approval) of the class instructor and assigned advisor.
3. If a student adds a class after making their initial payment or payment plan arrangements they assume full financial obligations for any tuition and fees associated with the course(s) added.

### **Dropping a Course**

Students who wish to drop a course after their initial enrollment must complete a Schedule Change Form in the Registrar's Office.

1. A student who withdraws from a course after the 20<sup>th</sup> day of classes will receive a "W" (no grade or penalty) for the course.
2. Any class dropped after the semester begins requires the signature of the class instructor and assigned advisor.
3. A student will be allowed to drop a course up to and including the Final Drop Day as indicated on the Master Calendar. The Final Drop Day is determined by calculating 80% of the allotted class time. Courses not meeting the entire semester will be calculated in the same manner.
4. A student remains responsible for payment of tuition and fees if the drop occurs after the tuition refund date as indicated on the Master Calendar.
5. If a student is dropped from an online course by the Registrar's Office for non-completion of 25%, the student remains responsible for the charges incurred by the online class.

### **Withdrawal from College**

A student who wishes to withdraw from the College before the end of the semester must complete an official Schedule Change Form and confer with the College Counselor, Director of Financial Aid, Registrar, and Business Office Clerk. A student remains responsible for payment of tuition and fees after the tuition refund date. Additionally, a student who attends less than 60% of the allotted class time and receives federal financial aid will be responsible for returning a portion of that aid. A student who officially withdraws from College before the withdrawal deadline will receive a "W" (no credit or penalty) for each course.

#### **FEES**

All Main Campus students are assessed \$32.50 per credit hour for student fees. The money collected is used to assist with technology advancement, student ID cards, parking, student activity travel, student health center operations, building debt payment, building rent for off-campus programs, access to college sporting, musical and theatrical events, in-state scholarship funding, and Student Government Association (SGA) activities.

Technical campus day students are assessed a program consumables fee ranging from \$125 to \$250 per semester depending on program. Part-time and High School students are assessed a program consumables fee ranging from \$65 to \$300 depending upon the program. Certified Nurse's Assistant (CNA) and Certified Medication Aide (CMA) fees range from \$100 to \$120 depending on location. Home Health Aide (HHA) fees are \$50; and the CMA update is \$25. Short-term evening class students do not pay a student fee, however, a materials fee may be assessed in some classes; these fees are subject to change. Safety glasses and earplugs may be purchased in the Technical Campus offices.

#### **PAYMENT OF TUITION AND FEES AND RESIDENTIAL HOUSING**

Payment of tuition, fees and residential housing are due before the first day of classes. The enrollment is not finalized until payment is made in full, payment options have been set up, or Financial Aid is confirmed. If Financial Aid does not cover the student account balance, a payment is required. If Financial Aid is not confirmed, a payment is required. The Business Office can accept payments over the phone via credit/debit card or log into Raven Access.

ACCESS Payment Option: Payments in full and monthly payments can be made by utilizing the online ACCESS system. Log on to [www.coffeyville.edu](http://www.coffeyville.edu) and select Raven Access. A password and username is required. Please scroll down to the Access Help window for guidance. Once you have logged in, select Business Office, Student Account Balances, My Account Balance and Make a Payment. The amount and payment information will be requested, please be sure to complete all required fields. You will receive a payment confirmation via email and also a receipt from the CCC Business Office. If you have any questions regarding your payment or receipt, please contact the Business Office at 620.252.7007 or 620.252.7356. Students can utilize ACCESS to check the activity of their account balances. This will show transactions (charges and credits) of added and/or dropped classes and financial aid transactions. Any preliminary financial aid awards that are shown on the account as "suspended" are only "estimated" and can change due to federal requirements and eligibility. A student can also check the financial aid disbursement dates from Raven Access.

CCC Payment Option: To set up a payment plan to be automatically charged to your credit or debit card each month, please contact the Business Office. The online

payments are secure and easy. The payment option is interest free. A \$25 non-refundable fee will be applied to your first payment for setting up a payment option. This fee helps to offset the cost of the merchant and credit card fees assessed by the credit card companies. Any charges incurred by the College for delinquent accounts will be assessed to and will be the responsibility of the account holder. College policy is to disclose all unpaid account information to a collection agency.

### **GOLD CARD**

Residents of Montgomery and Cherokee Counties, age 55 or older, are invited to apply for the CCC Gold Card. This card permits the card holder to enroll in a maximum of six (6) college credit hours per academic year at a reduced rate of \$32.50 per credit hour (\$150 maximum). A 10 percent discount is available on enrollment in continuing education clock hour classes at the Technical Campuses. Payment of all fees and/or books is the responsibility of the student. ### **WELLNESS CARD**

Residents of Montgomery County who are age 21 or older are invited to apply for a free Community Wellness Card. The Community Wellness Card allows the holder to take up to three (3) college credit hours per semester of wellness courses tuition free. Payments of any fees and/or books are the responsibility of the student. The Community Wellness Card must be presented at the time of registration. ### **STUDENT ID CARD**

Student ID cards are provided to students enrolled in six (6) or more credit hours in a semester. The student ID card admits students to numerous student activities, permits students to check out items in the library, and affords other opportunities limited to currently enrolled students. Students must report to the Student Success Center within the first two weeks of classes with the pink finalized registration form and current address to obtain a picture ID. Lost or late cards will be assessed a \$10.00 processing fee.

Community and College IDs may also be issued upon request to those who are not full-time students, and at no charge. Proof of a current address and phone number is required. These IDs are used for the library resources, and do not provide student activity privileges.

### **TESTING & PLACEMENT**

In an effort to ensure student success in academic courses, all students are mandatorily placed in their first English and math courses based on ACT, SAT, ASSET, or COMPASS test scores. Students, who have taken the ACT/SAT, should have their test scores sent to Coffeyville Community College or should bring a copy of their scores when enrolling for the first time at CCC. There is no testing fee for the initial COMPASS test at CCC. Students who elect to complete the COMPASS test more than once will be charged \$10 per test. **Students are required to show a photo ID to the test monitor before taking a placement test.** Testing is available in the Student Success Center or by appointment in the Advising Center.

### **ADVISING**

The Advising Office is located in the upper level of the Student Union. The office is staffed from 8 a.m. until 5 p.m. Monday through Friday during fall and spring semesters. Summer hours are 8 a.m. until 5 p.m. Monday through Thursday. Trained academic advisors assist with the enrollment process. For information, call 620.252.7002.

### **BOOKSTORE**

The College Bookstore is located in Weinberg Hall and open from 9:00 a.m – 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday. It offers an array of official College merchandise, books, and school supplies. A complete list of course textbooks, including ISBN numbers and retail price information, are available on the College website at [www.coffeyville.edu/bookstore.html](http://www.coffeyville.edu/bookstore.html). Business hours may vary during peak times and holidays; please call or visit the Bookstore's website to verify hours.

### **EVENING SERVICES**

Students may enroll during regular day office hours and at the first night of class. Early enrollment is encouraged to help ensure student placement in the class of choice.

### **GRAHAM LIBRARY**

The Graham Library is at the heart of the CCC main campus and includes 23,000 books, 81 current periodicals, 9 Internet workstations and a staff that is trained to assist in research and service. Online subscriptions to research databases may be accessed from the library web pages on campus at [www.coffeyville.edu](http://www.coffeyville.edu).

Named for Dr. Russell H. Graham, the College's second president, the Graham Library provides students with resources and services to enable successful completion of course work. Students with a valid photo ID may use the Student Success Center and the library. Non-students are also welcome to use the facility by applying for the Community ID card in the library.

**ADULT EDUCATION CENTER**

Coffeyville Community College provides the opportunity for individuals who do not have a high school diploma to earn a GED by offering classroom instruction at the Adult Education Center. The Adult Education Center is located in Orscheln Hall, 8<sup>th</sup> & Beech Streets. The Center offers a variety of services including, but not limited to, the following: Job Skill Training, Literacy Programs, Individualized Educational Plans, Post Secondary/Counseling, Basic Skills Development, and Compass/GED Preparation.

The Center is open Monday through Thursday, 8 a.m. to 7 p.m. Call 620.252.7000 to enroll in class sessions.

**INTERNET ACCESS**

Coffeyville Community College provides Internet access in the Student Success Center and in the Computer Labs. Students should contact the Computer Lab Supervisor in Lab WH103 to arrange for computer access. CCC also provides numerous wireless “hot spots” and cell phone usage. This includes the cafeteria, library, outside courtyard, as well as, the majority of the academic buildings. This service is free to students. Students who experience difficulty connecting may contact the IT Department for assistance. For information on Internet access in the residence halls, please contact the Residence Hall Director.

**ONLINE CLASSES**

Coffeyville Community College offers a variety of online classes to meet the needs of the students. Online classes are listed with the traditional classes as well as class specific information from each online instructor. Online class information is also posted on the CCC website at [www.coffeyville.edu](http://www.coffeyville.edu) within the “Online Classes” link. Log-in instructions can be obtained by viewing the “Instructional Video” located at the top of this link.

**NOTE**

All online courses are required to maintain a 25% completion date. The student must have 25% of the course material completed by this date. Failure to complete 25% by the set date will result in the student being administratively dropped from the course. The student remains responsible for payment of tuition and fees if the drop occurs after the refund dates as indicated on the master calendar.

**RAVEN ACCESS**

Coffeyville Community College offers students the availability to receive and view their records and College information on-line. Visit [www.coffeyville.edu](http://www.coffeyville.edu) and click on Raven Access. Enter username (Student ID#) and password (Last 4 digits of SSN). NOTE: Change password immediately by clicking on Personal Info to the right of your name, click Password Tab and type in old password and create a new password. 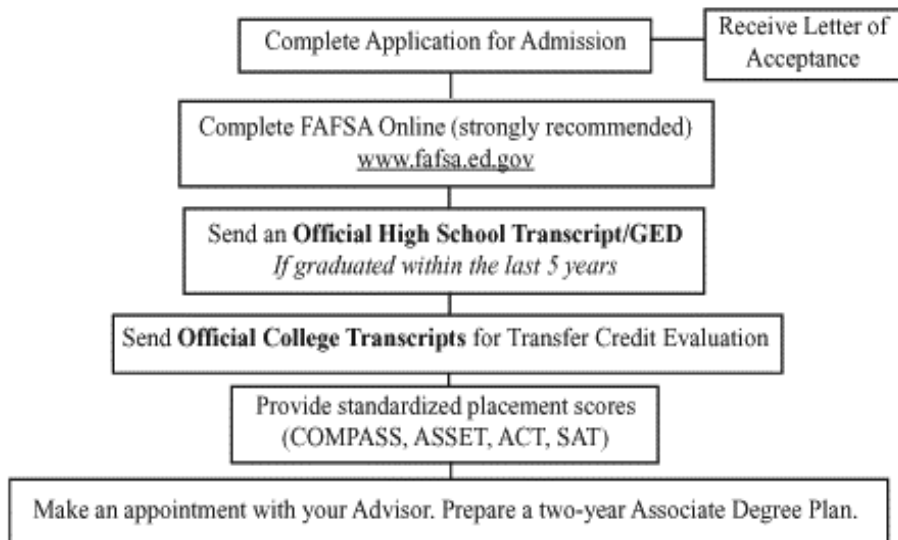

**ALERT NOW**

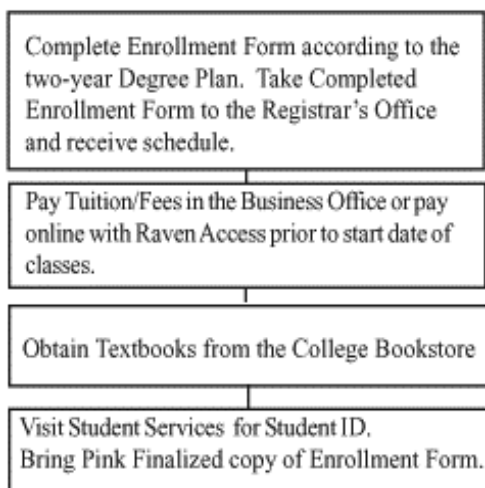

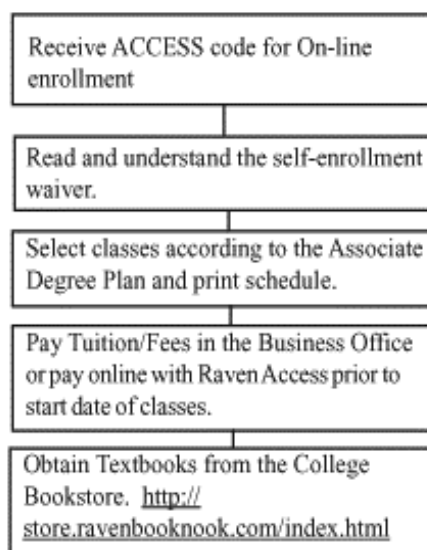
## Degree Seeking Student Enrollment Flowchart

Students who are enrolling full-time are required to have placement test scores and transcripts in the Registrar's office before they are able to complete enrollment. If a student is enrolling for summer session and does not have access to their completed high school transcript a letter from a high school official stating a graduation date may be accepted until the transcript can be sent.

## **PARTNERSHIP IN EDUCATION**

In 1989, the Kansas Regents institutions and the accredited public community colleges in Kansas agreed to honor a transfer agreement to facilitate the transition of community college students to any of the Regents institutions in the State. The Kansas Regents institutions are Emporia State University, Fort Hays State University, Kansas State University, Pittsburg State University, the University of Kansas, and Wichita State University.

Students can check the transferability of classes from Coffeyville Community College through the CCC website [www.coffeyville.edu](http://www.coffeyville.edu). A community college student who abides by the Transfer Articulation Agreement will automatically be awarded junior status at any of the six Regents institutions in Kansas. IN ADDITION TO THE Transfer Articulation Agreement with Kansas Regents Institutions, Coffeyville Community College has developed several program specific transfer agreements with many other schools including, but not limited to: Friends University, Wichita, KS; Kansas Newman University, Newton, KS; Kansas State University, Salina, KS; Missouri Southern, Joplin, Missouri; Northeastern State University, Tahlequah, Oklahoma; Oklahoma Wesleyan University, Bartlesville, OK; Pittsburg State University/Technical Division, Rogers State University, Claremore and Bartlesville, Oklahoma; Sterling College, Sterling, KS; Texas A&M, Commerce, Texas; and Washburn University, Topeka, Kansas.

Coffeyville Community College also works closely with Northeastern Technical, Tri-County Technical and Wes Watkins Technical in Oklahoma to allow students to receive college credit for their technical programs. Students can apply their technical credit to an Associate in Applied Science or an Associate in Arts Degree.
