Application Requirements

1. Current letter of admission to Coffeyville Community College (CCC). **Notice:** You must be admitted to Coffeyville Community College to make application to the Nursing Program.
2. 2 (two) official transcripts for all colleges, universities, and/or vocational schools attended since high school (and a high school transcript if applicable) are to be submitted with application packet; one is for the nursing department and one is for the college registrar's office.
3. Verification of an active CNA certification (or Kansas PN licensure).
4. A reference letter from either a previous faculty member, or current employer.
5. A two-page typed, double-spaced letter expressing your goals for your nursing education and practice.
6. If applicable, a one-page typed statement explaining any unsuccessful completion of previous nursing program(s), nursing courses/curriculum.
7. Students with BS or higher degrees are to call the Director of Nursing so that appropriate credit may be awarded.

Pre-admission Exams

Performance on the ACT or SAT, and the COMPASS test are important indicators of successful college experiences. The COMPASS test is required as a pre-admission exam and is given in the student success center.

Notice: Nonnative English speakers are required to take the TOEFL © (Test of English as a Foreign Language™) to measure how well students can read, listen, speak, and write in English in the classroom. A TOEFL score of; 213 Computer, 550 Paper and Pencil, and Spoken English score of 50 is required to make application to the Nursing Program.

The KSBN has approved the following scores for the new TOEFL iBT; each area must meet the minimum requirement.

LPN-RN Transfer Students

Licensed Practical Nurses must seek admission to the Nursing Program by following the standard nursing admissions process. LPNs that have not graduated from the 1 + 1 PN Nursing Program are required to have a transcript evaluation by the Director of Nursing so that appropriate credit may be awarded. Additional Kansas Core PN Curriculum courses may have to be completed to continue in the Associate Degree Nursing Program. The LPN Bridge course must be taken prior to/or concurrently in the first semester of the Associate Degree Nursing Program. For further information see the LPN-RN Program information.

Selection Process and GPA Requirement

Applicant must apply by September 30, 2010 for the Spring 2011 program.

Enrollment in the 1 + 1 Nursing Program may be limited because of available health care facilities in the community, as well as limited faculty and financial resources at the community college.

Notice: A cumulative GPA of 2.75 is required to make application to the Nursing Program while maintaining a grade of “C” or higher in each prerequisite course.

Admission is primarily based upon a point system. The admission point scale is designed to objectively evaluate applicants for the 1 + 1 Nursing Program. Applicants with the highest total points will be ranked above other applicants for the available positions in the program.

Preference may be given to applicants:

- ☞ Who have a cumulative grade point of 3.0 or higher.
- ☞ Who have earned acceptable ACT or SAT, and COMPASS test scores indicative of successful college skill levels.
- ☞ Who have earned pre-requisite courses at Coffeyville Community College.
- ☞ Who have the highest pre-requisite grade points.
- ☞ Who have taken their CNA certificate course at Coffeyville Community College.
- ☞ Who have an exceptional reference letter from either a previous faculty member, or current Employer.
- ☞ Who have an exceptional letter expressing personal goals for nursing education and practice (Format: Two-page typed, double-spaced).

Selected candidates will be notified by mail in writing by November 1, 2010 for Spring 2011 admission and enrollment.

Immunizations and Clinical Requirements

A licensed nurse must be capable to function safely and effectively in a variety of clinical situations, as well as meeting specific legal standards and professional guidelines. The theory and clinical practicum requirements of the Nursing Program are essential for nursing practice and students are expected to participate and perform the skills at the competent level to be successful in the Nursing Program.

A disabled prospective nursing student may apply for reasonable accommodations to likewise function safely and effectively in the Nursing Program. The Director of Nursing will work in conjunction with the CCC Disabilities Coordinator to review the requests for reasonable accommodations prior to determining if such requests can be provided.

Prior to enrolling in the Nursing program students **MUST** provide documentation of required immunizations, American Heart CPR Certification, and background checks. Also, liability insurance (MARSH www.proliability.com), and a CCC Medicine-Medical Evaluation (CCC Form) are required.

- a complete Hepatitis B vaccination series (series of three, titer, or waiver),
- MMR vaccination(s) or a positive titer,
- a negative PPD or negative chest X-Ray,
- Tdap booster,
- written verification of varicella history, varicella vaccination, or titer,

Note: Additional random screenings may be required by the clinical facilities. A student will not be able to attend clinical in an agency if immunizations are not current.

Curriculum

PN Nursing Program Philosophy

The Kansas Core Curriculum Philosophy is embedded in the 1 + 1 Nursing Program at Coffeyville Community College and serves as the organizing framework for the program objectives. By incorporating a set of conceptual beliefs about health, nursing, clients, practical nursing, education and learning, and the environment, graduates will have the knowledge, skills, attitudes, and abilities needed to safely and effectively practice nursing. As an entry level practical nurse the graduate will be prepared to meet the client's basic needs throughout the lifespan through the promotion, maintenance, and restoration of health.

The conceptual framework is generated from the mission and philosophy of the 1 + 1 Nursing Program at Coffeyville Community College. The conceptual definitions are as follows:

Health-The CCCNP faculty and students believe health is defined within three areas; promotion, maintenance, and restoration. Health promotion, maintenance, and restoration are defined as client care that incorporates knowledge of expected stages of growth and development, and prevention and/early detection of health problems.

Nursing-The CCCNP faculty and students believe nursing is both an art and a science. We believe nurses provide care for client's basic biological, cultural, spiritual, and psychosocial needs throughout the lifespan. Nurses provide comfort in a caring environment. Critical thinking and the nursing process are the primary clinical problem-solving and decision making tools of the nurse. The nurse is part of and collaborates with the interdisciplinary healthcare team within the healthcare system and the community. Nurses are countable for providing care within the scope of ethical and legal responsibilities.

Clients-The CCCNP faculty and students believe clients (individuals, family and significant others) are finite beings with varying capabilities to function in society. Clients are unique and have defined systems of daily living that reflect their values, cultures, motives, and lifestyles.

Practical Nursing-The CCCNP faculty and students believe practical nurses provide care of clients with commonly occurring health problems that have predictable outcomes. The practical nurse provides care under the supervision of a registered nurse or a person licensed to practice medicine and surgery or dentistry.

Education and Learning-The CCCNP faculty and students believe they are partners in the acquisition of; knowledge, skills, attitudes, abilities, critical thinking skills, and the problem solving and decision-making nursing process in a supportive adult learning environment. Promoting student success and instilling a value of lifelong learning is integral to the success of the discipline and practice of nursing.

Environment-The CCCNP faculty and students believe environment is both internal and external. The internal environment includes biological, cultural, spiritual and psychosocial aspects. The external environment is the set of circumstances, objects or external conditions that positively or negatively affects the health and well-being of clients.

Curriculum Conceptual Definitions

Nursing Process-a scientific approach to clinical decision making which incorporates evidence-based practice and critical thinking. The steps of the process include assessment, planning, implementation, and evaluation.

Professional Behavior-behaviors that demonstrate intellectual and personal integrity which include: dedication to the client's welfare, commitment to the discipline, adherence to college, program, and agency policies.

Collaboration/Communication- the verbal and non-verbal interaction among the practical nurse and members of the healthcare team with client's, families, and significant others. Nursing care associated with clients is validated in written/and/or electronic records that reflect standards of practice and accountability in the provision of care.

Basic Needs-physiological, psychosocial, and spiritual requirements necessary for optimal functioning. Physiological needs are basic needs related to the functioning of body systems essential to life; oxygen, hydration, nutrition, bowel elimination, urinary elimination, activity/mobility, rest and sleep, hygiene, skin/tissue integrity, comfort and physiological safety. Psychosocial and spiritual needs include; sexuality, emotional security, communication and cognition, love and belonging, self-esteem and self-actualization. As physiological needs are sufficiently satisfied, psychosocial and spiritual needs emerge. When there is an interference with ones ability to meet basic needs, health problems may result.

Safety-a safe and effective care environment includes providing protection of clients and healthcare personnel from health and environmental hazards.

We believe nurses provide care for client, family, and community's biological, cultural, spiritual, and psychosocial needs throughout the lifespan. Nurses provide competent, compassionate care in the healthcare environment. Critical thinking and the nursing process are the primary clinical problem-solving and decision making tools of the nurse. The nurse is part of and collaborates with the interdisciplinary healthcare team within the healthcare system and the community. Nurses are accountable for providing care within the scope of ethical and legal responsibilities.
- Clients-The CCCNP faculty and students believe clients (individuals, family, and community) are finite beings with varying capabilities to function in society. Clients are unique and have defined systems of daily living that reflect their values, cultures, motives, and lifestyles.
- Registered Nursing-The CCCNP faculty and students believe registered nurses provide evidence-based professional nursing care for clients, families, and communities throughout their lifespan as an integral member of the healthcare team. Registered Nurses make and communicate clinical judgments utilizing critical thinking attitudes and skills through the decision-making nursing process.
- Education and Learning-The CCCNP faculty and students believe they are partners in the acquisition of; knowledge, skills, attitudes, abilities, critical thinking skills, and the problem solving and decision-making nursing process in a supportive adult learning environment. Promoting student success and instilling a value of life long learning is integral to the success of the discipline and practice of nursing.
- Environment-The CCCNP faculty and students believe environment is both internal and external. The internal environment includes biological, cultural, spiritual and psychosocial aspects. The external environment is the set of circumstances, objects or external conditions that positively or negatively affects the health and well-being of clients.

Biological needs are basic needs related to the functioning of body systems essential to life; oxygen, hydration, nutrition, bowel elimination, urinary elimination, activity/mobility, rest and sleep, hygiene, skin/tissue integrity, comfort and physiological safety. Psychosocial and spiritual needs include; sexuality, emotional security, communication and cognition, love and belonging, self-esteem and self-actualization. As physiological needs are sufficiently satisfied, psychosocial and spiritual needs emerge. Diverse cultural and spiritual needs are unique to each client and family within the community and require recognition, acceptance, and support from nursing and the healthcare team. When there is an interference with ones ability to meet needs, health problems may result.

Safety-a safe and effective care environment includes providing protection of clients and healthcare personnel from health and environmental hazards.

The Registered Nursing Program Outcomes for 1+1 Nursing Program at Coffeyville Community College

Practice within the legal, ethical, and regulatory frameworks of the nursing profession, engaging in life-long learning, and participating in professional development.

Readmission

Readmission to the Nursing Program is contingent on an evaluation of past academic performance in class, clinical, availability of clinical space, and nursing faculty recommendations. Any student who is unsuccessful in a nursing course will not be permitted to continue in the Nursing Program. Unsuccessful is defined as receiving a grade of “D” or “F” or “W.” A student may not repeat any nursing program course more than two (2) times. The student must submit a written request for readmission to the **Director of Nursing before 8:00 a.m. on the Monday after final exams** with the following information.

1. Student's name, date, day of exiting the Nursing Program, and which semester the student is seeking readmission
2. Student's request for readmission and “Academic Success” plan to complete the nursing program.
3. Student's cumulative GPA, previous semester GPA, and a copy of previous clinical evaluation tool (if readmission course has a clinical component).

Completion

The PN Program must be completed within 4 semesters (2 academic years). The ADN RN Program must be completed within 6 semesters (3 academic years).

Requirements for Graduation

A student is eligible for an Associate of Applied Science Degree in Nursing by meeting the following requirements.

- Complete the total 74 credit hours of the ADN Nursing Program
- Maintain a GPA of 2.5 or higher while enrolled in the ADN Nursing Program
- Earn a minimum of 15 of the last Nursing Program credit hours at CCC
- Be enrolled during the semester in which requirements for the ADN are completed

A student is eligible for a Certificate in Practical Nursing by meeting the following requirements

- Complete 30 credit hours of the PN Nursing Program at CCC
- Complete 10 credit hours of prerequisite and general education courses at a regionally accredited college recognized by the U.S. Department of Education.
- Maintain a GPA of 2.5 or higher while enrolled in the PN Nursing Program
- Be enrolled during the semester in which requirements for the PN Nursing Program are completed

Kansas State Board of Nursing (KSBN) Licensure

The following qualifications are required for any individual who seeks to take the NCLEX-PN (Practical Nurse) or NCLEX-RN (Registered Nurse) for licensure in the state of Kansas.

1. Have graduated from a high school accredited by the appropriate legal accrediting agency or have obtained the equivalent of a high school education, as determined by the state department of education.
2. Have graduated from a KSBN approved practical nursing /professional registered program(s) in the United States or in a foreign county.

Have you ever been convicted of a misdemeanor or felony Yes: _____ No: _____

The board may deny, revoke, limit or suspend any license, certificate of qualification or authorization to practice nursing as a registered professional nurse, as a licensed practical nurse, as an advanced registered nurse practitioner or as a registered nurse anesthetist that is issued by the board or applied for under this act or may publicly or privately censure a licensee or holder of a certificate of qualification or authorization, if the applicant, licensee or holder of a certificate of qualification or authorization is found after hearing:

(1) To be guilty of fraud or deceit in practicing nursing or in procuring or attempting to procure a license to practice nursing;

(2) to have been guilty of a felony or to have been guilty of a misdemeanor involving an illegal drug offense unless the applicant or licensee establishes sufficient rehabilitation to warrant the public trust, except that notwithstanding K.S.A. 74-120 no license, certificate of qualification or authorization to practice nursing as a licensed professional nurse, as a licensed practical nurse, as an advanced registered nurse practitioner or registered nurse anesthetist shall be granted to a person with a felony conviction for a crime against persons as specified in article 34 of chapter 21 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated and acts amendatory thereof or supplemental thereto (**Grounds for disciplinary actions; proceedings; witnesses; costs; professional incompetency defined; criminal justice record information.** July 2009).

74-1112. Applicant for licensure as a professional nurse, practical nurse or mental health technician to be fingerprinted and submit to a state and national criminal history record check.

(a) The board of nursing may require an original applicant for licensure as a professional nurse, practical nurse or mental health technician to be fingerprinted and submit to a state and national criminal history record check. The fingerprints shall be used to identify the applicant and to determine whether the applicant has a record of criminal history in this state or other jurisdictions. The board of nursing is authorized to submit the fingerprints to the Kansas bureau of investigation and the federal bureau of investigation for a state and national criminal history record check. The board of nursing may use the information obtained from fingerprinting and the applicant's criminal history for purposes of verifying the identification of any applicant

and in the official determination of character and fitness of the applicant for any licensure to practice professional or practical nursing or mental health technology in this state.

(b) Local and state law enforcement officers and agencies shall assist the board of nursing in taking and processing 4 of fingerprints of applicants to practice professional or practical nursing or mental health technology in this state and shall release all records of adult convictions and non convictions and adult convictions or adjudications of another state or country to the board of nursing.
